Walking around Tokyo this spring, my eyes felt itchy, and I started sneezing. I thought it was hay fever, which is a common and growing issue in Japan. Over 50% of the Japanese population have a pollen allergy. _____(33)_____, some people call hay fever Japan's "national disease" and say it is a hindrance to the economy. The country spends about \$2.5 billion a year on allergy medicine. Some people think that when hay fever is bad, people don't spend as much money because they stay inside and _____(34)_____ leisure activities outdoors.

The number of people with hay fever has surged in recent decades. A study showed that the percentage of people with this problem increased from about 20% in the 1990s to over 40% in 2019. One _____(35)_____ about why this problem got worse is that pollen builds up in people's bodies over time.

This national suffering is something the country _____(36)_____ itself. After cutting down many natural forests in the middle of the last century, the government quickly planted cedar trees, called *sugi* in Japanese, which were easy to grow and provide a lot of wood. Now, cedar trees make up 18% of Japan's forests, and another 10% are cypress trees, called *hinoki*. However, these new forests became a problem because they release a lot of pollen, and this gets worse as the trees get older. Around the 1990s, people started to realize that hay fever was becoming an increasing problem.

It has even become a political topic. The Tokyo Governor promised to completely get rid of pollen allergies in her plans for 2017. Politicians have tried to deal with this problem, but it's been slow. They need to replace the cedar forests gradually to avoid landslides, which are even more dangerous now because of increasing heavy rain. The government now wants to _____(37)_____ the amount of pollen released by 50% over the next 30 years and is trying to replace the cedar forests faster.

For now, it must alleviate the problem. The government wants more people to be able to get immunotherapy, which involves giving people small amounts of what they are allergic to so that their bodies get used to it. As for me, the results of my allergy test were surprising. I am allergic to dust, cats, and wheat. However, it turned out I am not allergic to cedar pollen after all. Even though I do not have hay fever, this experience makes me feel sorry for hay fever sufferers.
